CONCERT ETIQUETTE

Thank you for joining us this evening. As an audience member, you are an important part of tonight's concert. The audience's responsibility at formal concerts is to honor the efforts of the performers by providing a listening atmosphere in which all can appreciate their performance. To that end, we ask your cooperation:

- Be seated prior to the start of the program. If entering or leaving the concert hall after the program has begun, do so only during applause or when the performers are changing position.
- Please turn off all cell phones and any other device that may vibrate or make noise.
- Remain quiet during the musical performance. Talking, whispering, and other noises made with your program, handbags, candy wrappers, etc. can distract others.
- Never stand or move around while music is being performed. It distracts listeners around you, as well as the performers. If you must leave for any reason, wait until a piece is finished, and the audience is applauding. Also, return to your seat only between numbers.
- If very young children become restless and disrupt others' ability to listen, please take them from the auditorium until they are quiet. All children should be under the constant supervision of those responsible for their presence.
- Please show your appreciation for the performance by clapping after each selection.
- If a piece has multiple movements, it is customary to hold your applause until the last movement is completed. Watch the conductor when the music stops to decide whether or not to applaud.
- Always say "excuse me," if you must pass in front of someone while going to or from your seat.

TODD STALTER



Composer-conductor Todd Stalter is the Director of Bands at Eureka High School in Eureka, IL, and serves as Chair of the Department of Fine Arts for CUSD #140. His teaching responsibilities include directing all components of the high school band program, general music classes in grades K-6, and 5th & 6th grade brass and percussion technique classes. In his 28-year career at Eureka, Mr. Stalter's concert bands have consistently earned Superior ratings at Illinois High School Association contests, and his marching bands are 12-time Class 1A champions of the State of Illinois Invitational High School Marching Band Championships.

His bands have performed at Orchestra Hall, The Cotton Bowl, the Liberty Bowl, Walt Disney World, and at IHSA basketball and volleyball state tournaments. For nearly 30 years, Mr. Stalter served as Principal Trumpet and arranger for the "Grace Brass" at Grace Presbyterian Church in Peoria, IL, appearing on weekly television and radio broadcasts. As a conductor, Mr. Stalter has appeared with the Delaware All-State Junior Band, the Georgia Middle School All-State Band, the Rockford Youth Wind Ensemble, the ACSI Honor Band, several ILMEA District Bands, and at numerous local and regional high school and junior high festivals. He has served as an Illinois All-State Trumpet adjudicator since 2008, and regularly judges Solo & Ensemble and Organizational contests for IHSA, IESA, and IGSMA.

Compositions by Mr. Stalter have been performed by the Chicago Symphony Brass Quintet, the Atlanta Youth Wind Symphony, the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Wind Symphony, and by several ensembles at the Midwest Clinic as well as at numerous All-State, national, and international concert festivals and clinics. As a clinician, he has presented at the Illinois Music Educators Convention and the Illinois State University Summer Band Symposium. Works for Band by Mr. Stalter are frequently selected for inclusion in Bandworld's "Top 100," appear on many state contest and festival lists throughout the United States, and are featured in several volumes of the resource series "Teaching Music Through Performance in Band" published by GIA.

Todd Stalter received his Bachelor of Music Education (cum laude) and Master of Music in Trumpet Performance from Illinois State University, where he studied trumpet with Richard Lehman (Solo Cornet of "The President's Own" United States Marine Band) and Dr. James Buckner, and conducting with Dr. Stephen K. Steele. He has served as a conducting assistant for such luminaries as Robert W. Smith, Gary Green, Larry Gookin, Marguerite Wilder, Randy Vaughan, Cody Birdwell, and Richard Floyd at the Music for All Summer Symposium, and lives in Eureka with his wife Angie, Director of Orchestras at Parkside Junior High School in Normal, IL; son Evan, a software developer for State Farm; and Hershey, the family Aussie-Doodle. DR. PETER J. GRIFFIN



Dr. Peter J. Griffin is Music Department Chair and Professor of Music at Elmhurst College. A member of the conducting faculty, he is also responsible for all areas of the music department. Prior to joining the faculty at Elmhurst College, he was Assistant Director of Bands at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, where he was Director of Athletic Bands and conducted concert bands, the British Brass Band, and the Marching Illini. In addition, he taught conducting and marching band procedures and was the coordinator of marching and concert band festivals at the campus. Before joining the faculty at Illinois he was the Assistant Director of Bands at the University of Wisconsin-Madison where he worked with athletic bands, conducted one of its concert bands and taught in the School of Music. At his early teaching positions in Fowler and Colorado Springs, Colorado, Dr. Griffin taught beginning band through high school concert band, as well as jazz band, orchestra, vocal music, and general music.

Dr. Griffin is very active as a clinician, guest conductor, and adjudicator across the state of Illinois and throughout the United States. He has presented clinics on conducting and music education at the Illinois Music Educators Association state convention, the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic, the Music Educators National Conference, the College Band Directors National Association convention, and the Association of Concert Bands national convention. He served as the head clinician and co-director of the Smith Walbridge Drum Major Clinics, the University of New Hampshire Marching Band Clinic, and was twice co-producer/director of the pre-game and halftime shows at the Peach Bowl in Atlanta, Georgia. While at Illinois he directed the Marching Illini in performances across the country and at the Rose Parade, the Rose Bowl, and the St. Patrick's Day Parade in Dublin, Ireland. Additional international tours included performances in Tokyo, Japan, and throughout England and Ireland. As a historical researcher, Dr. Griffin has given many concerts centered on historical events or time periods, including civil war music on period instruments, and 4th of July concerts with the Concert Band of Central Illinois, a group he founded and directed.

Dr. Griffin is a native of Chicago and received his Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral degrees in Music Education from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He is a member of the College Band Directors National Association, National Association for Music Education, Illinois Music Education Association, Pi Kappa Lambda, Omicron Delta Kappa, Phi Mu Alpha (honorary membership), and Sigma Alpha Iota (Friend of the Arts). He also serves on the Midwest Clinic Advisory Committee.
